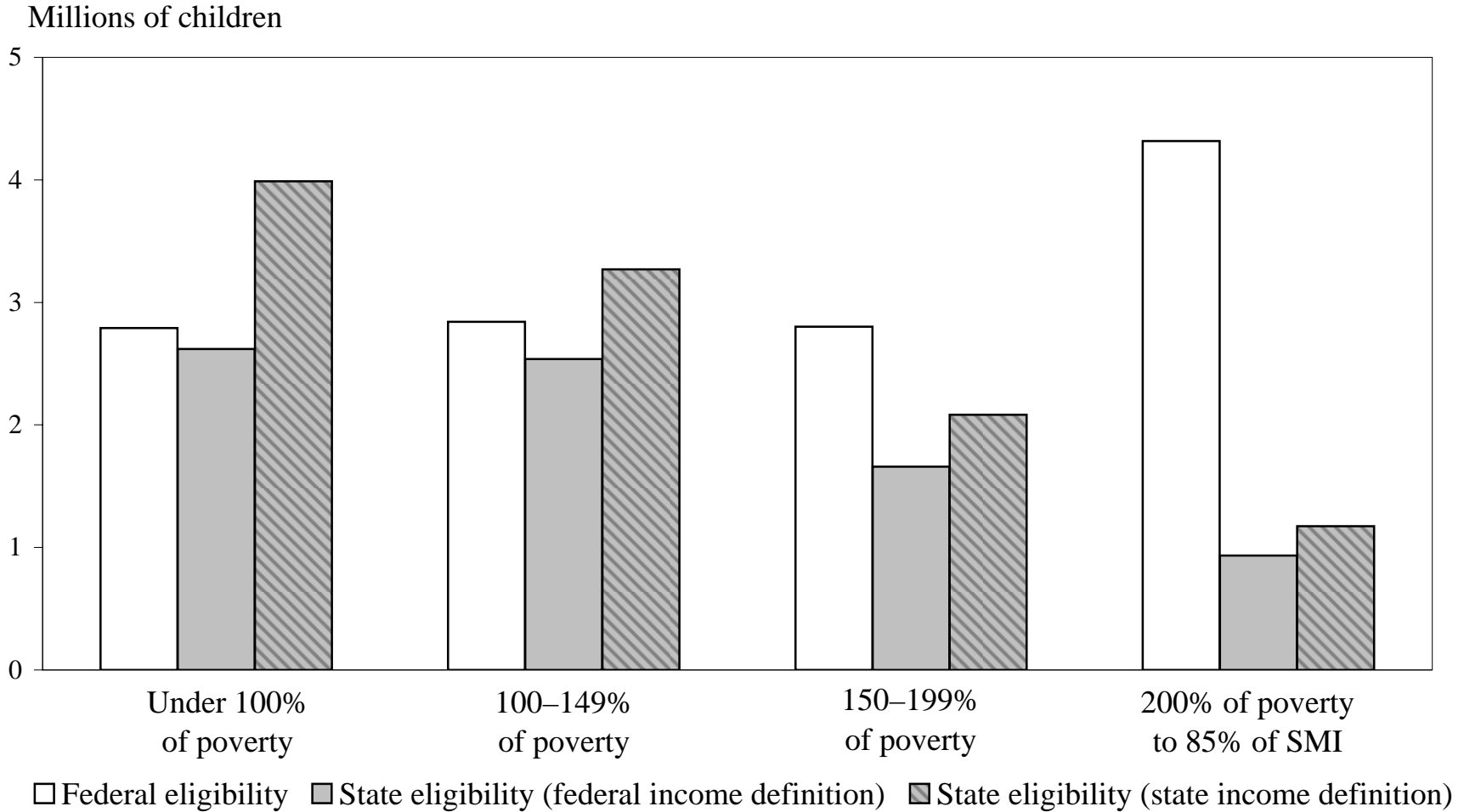
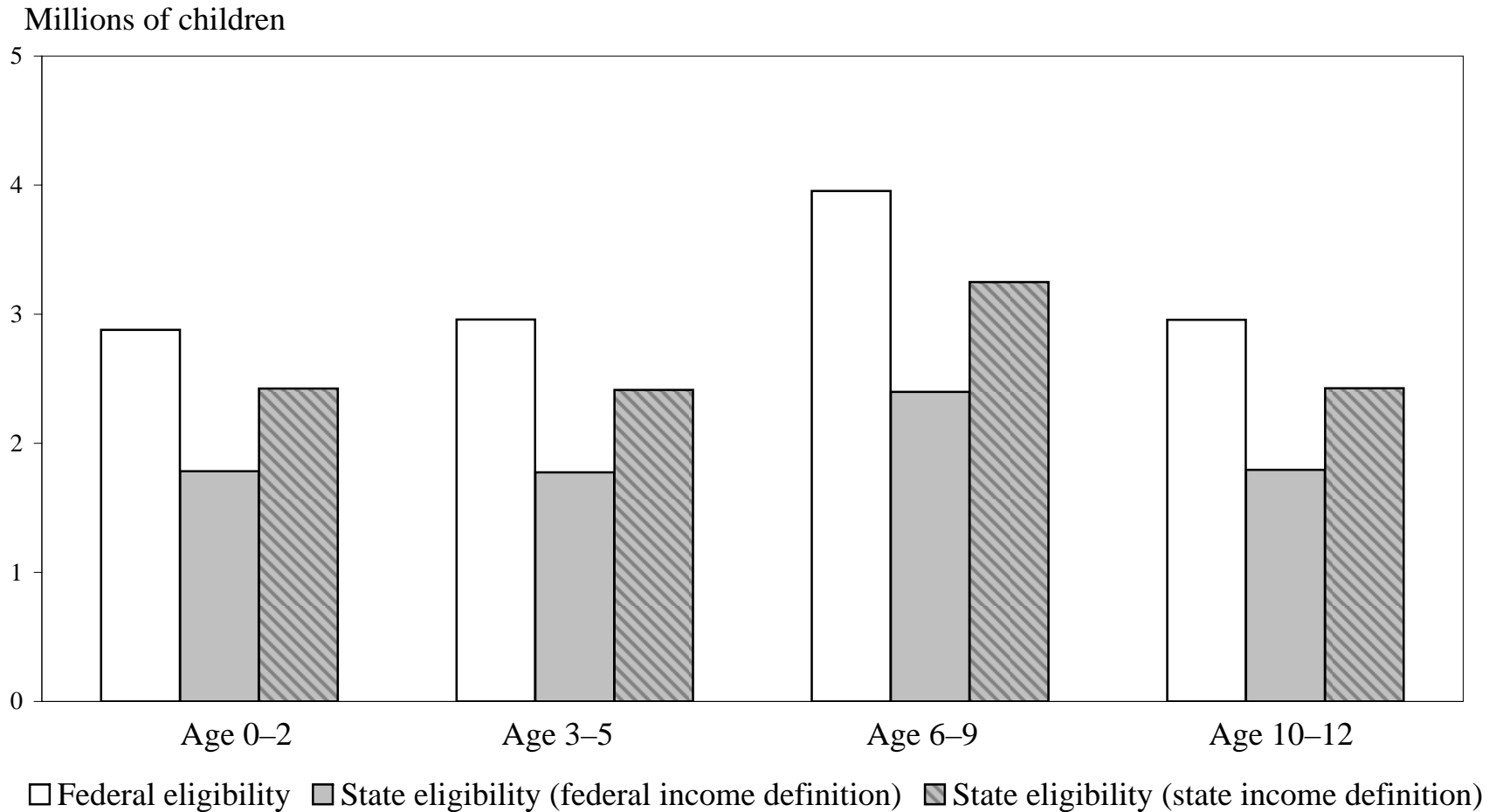

**Federal vs. State Rules (1999–2001)**



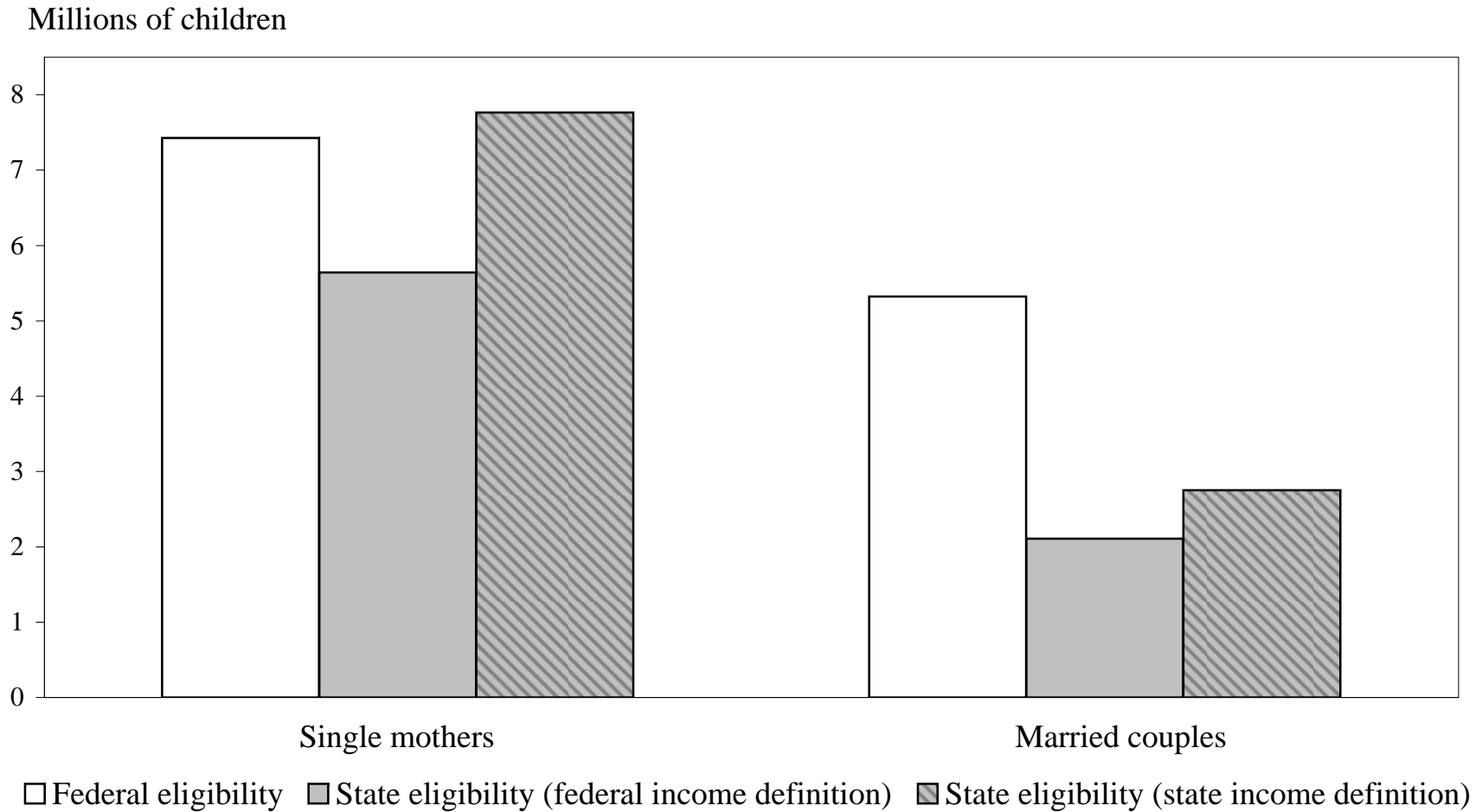

**Federal vs. State Rules (1999–2001)**



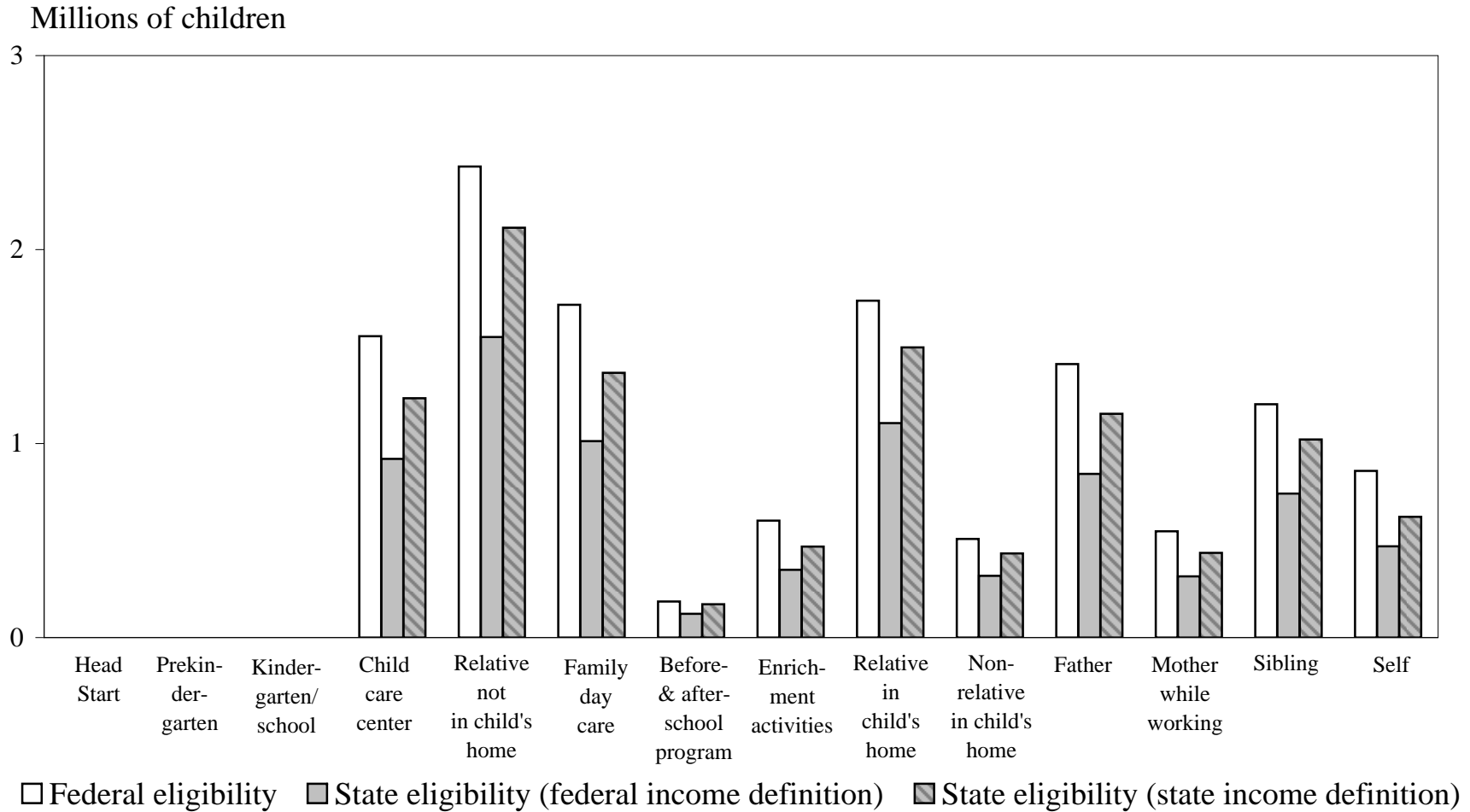

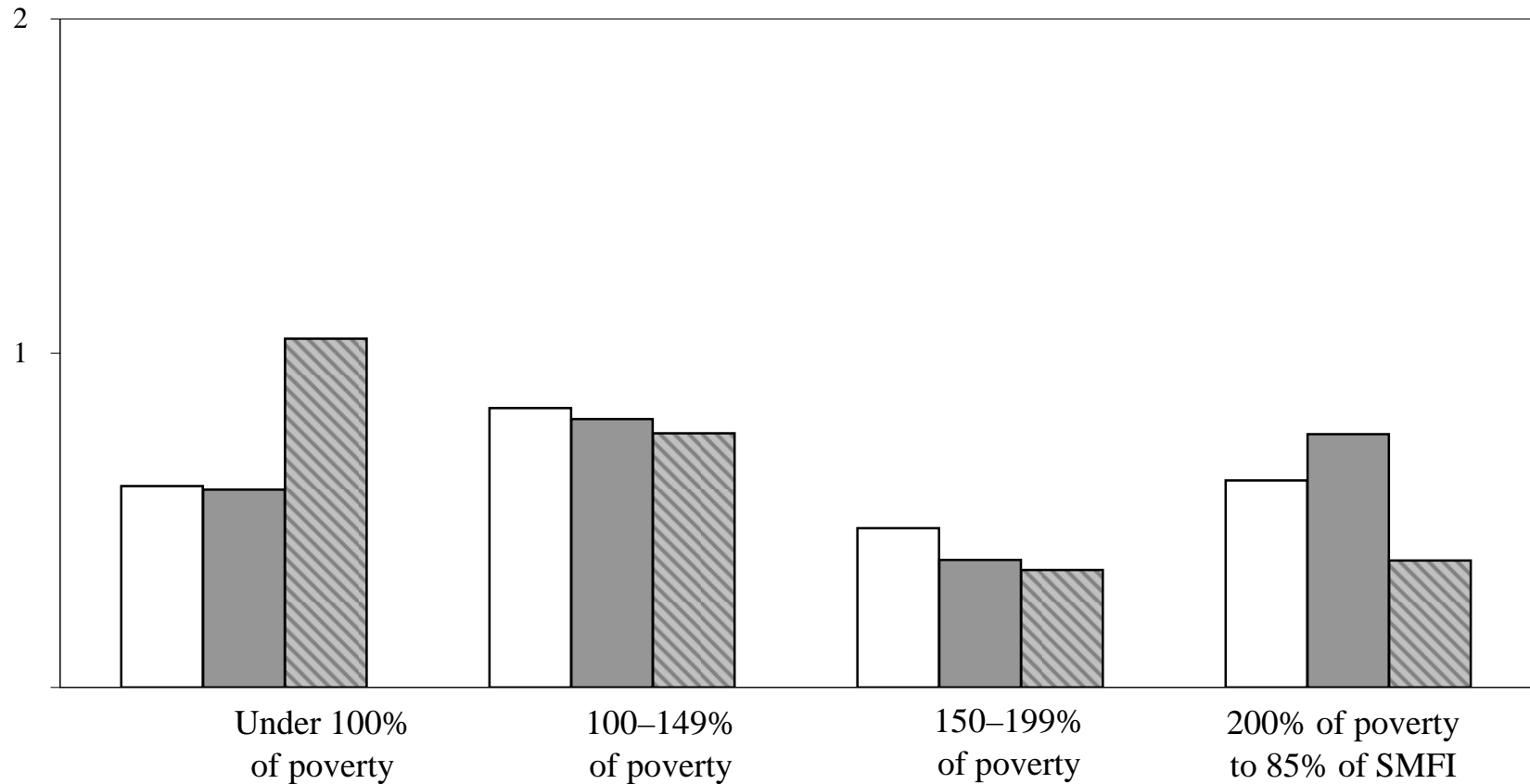

**Federal vs. State Rules (School Year, 1999–2001)**

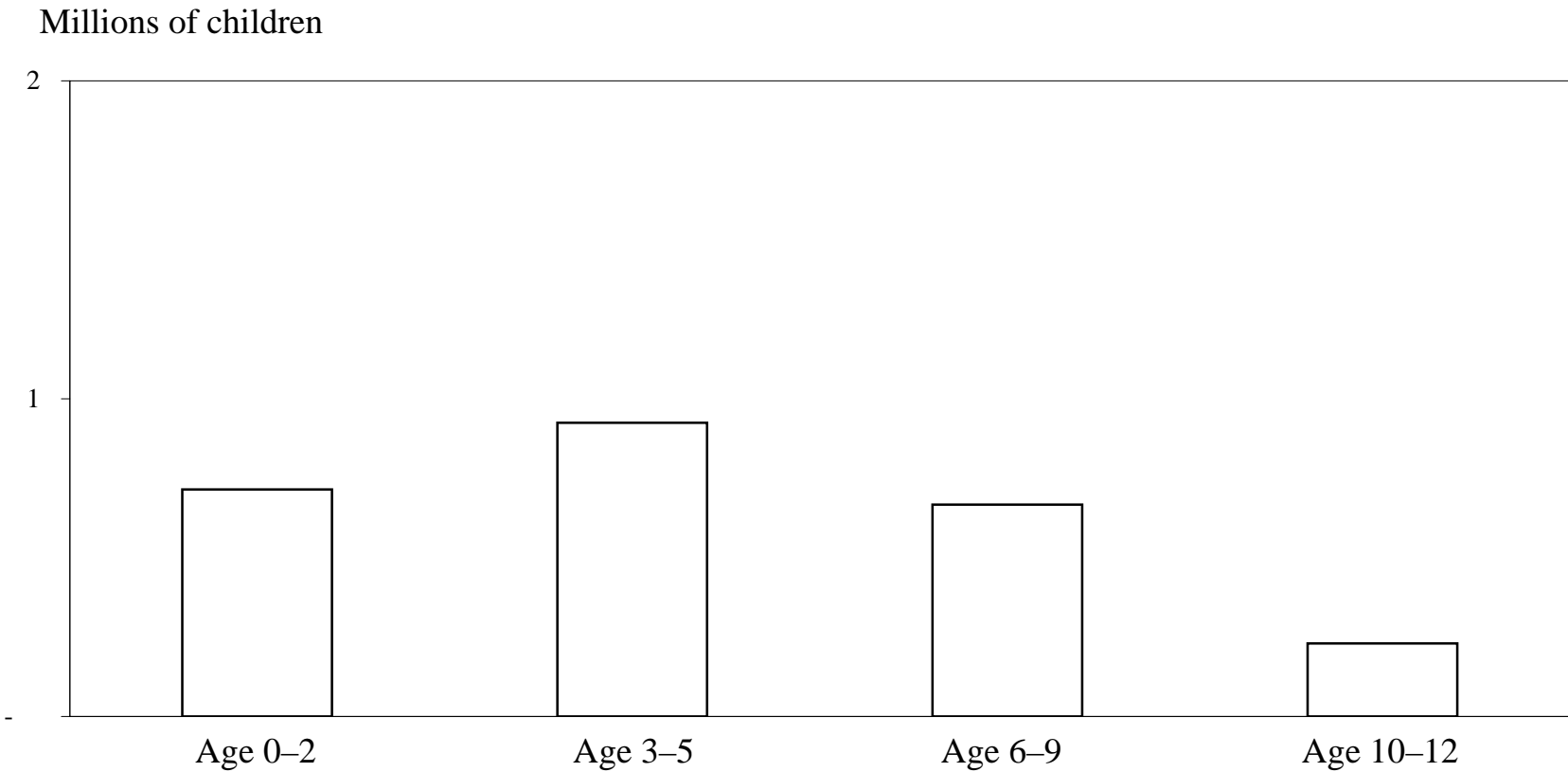

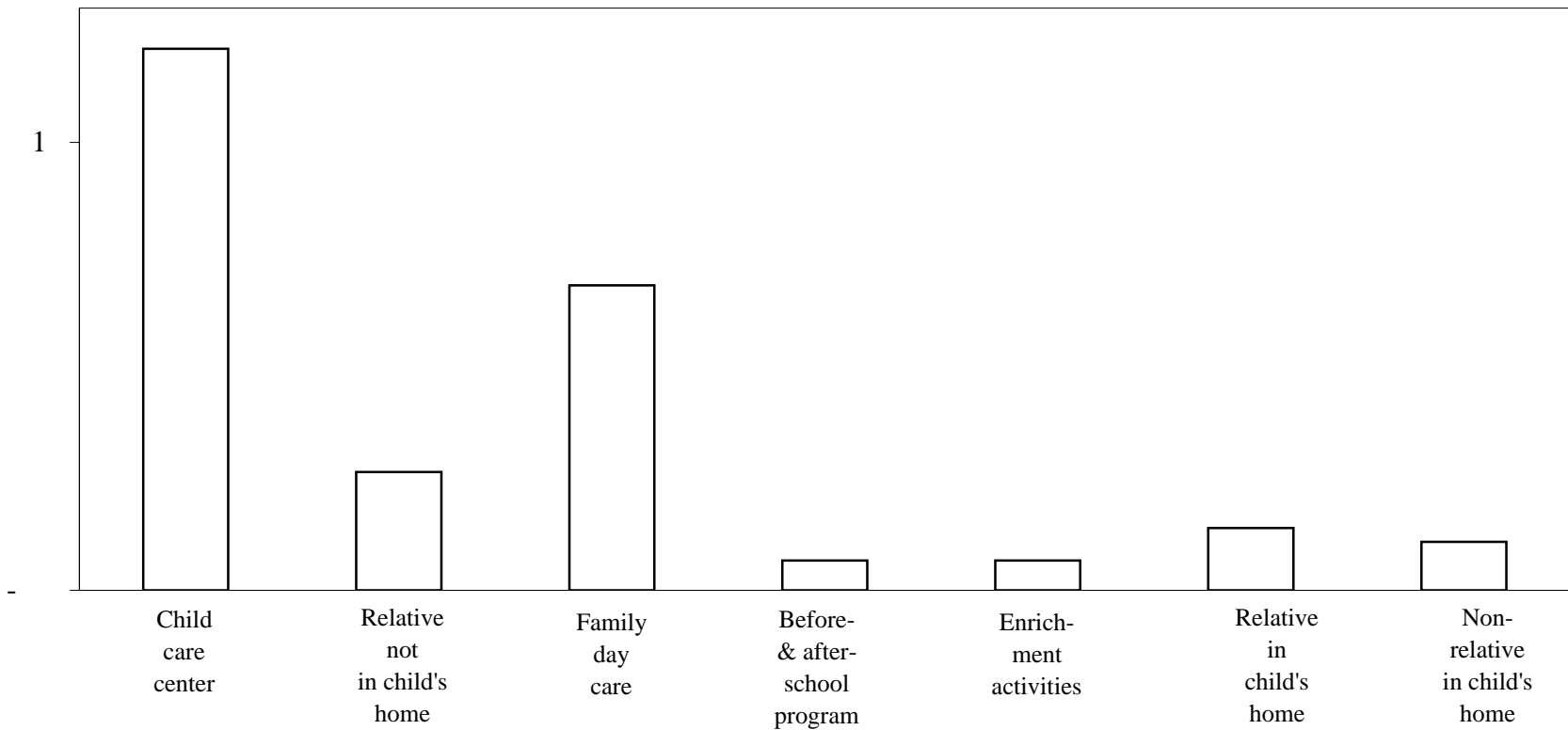

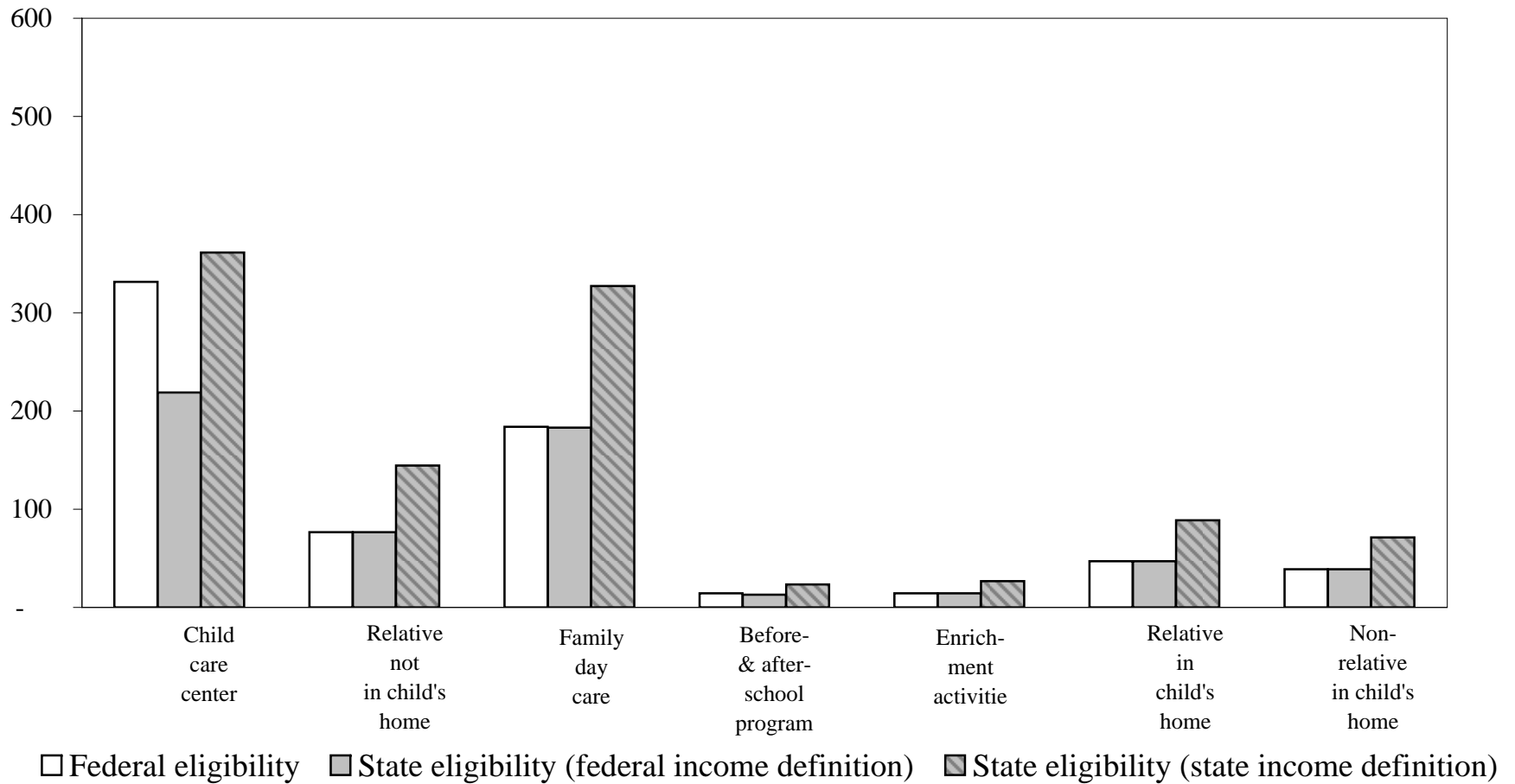

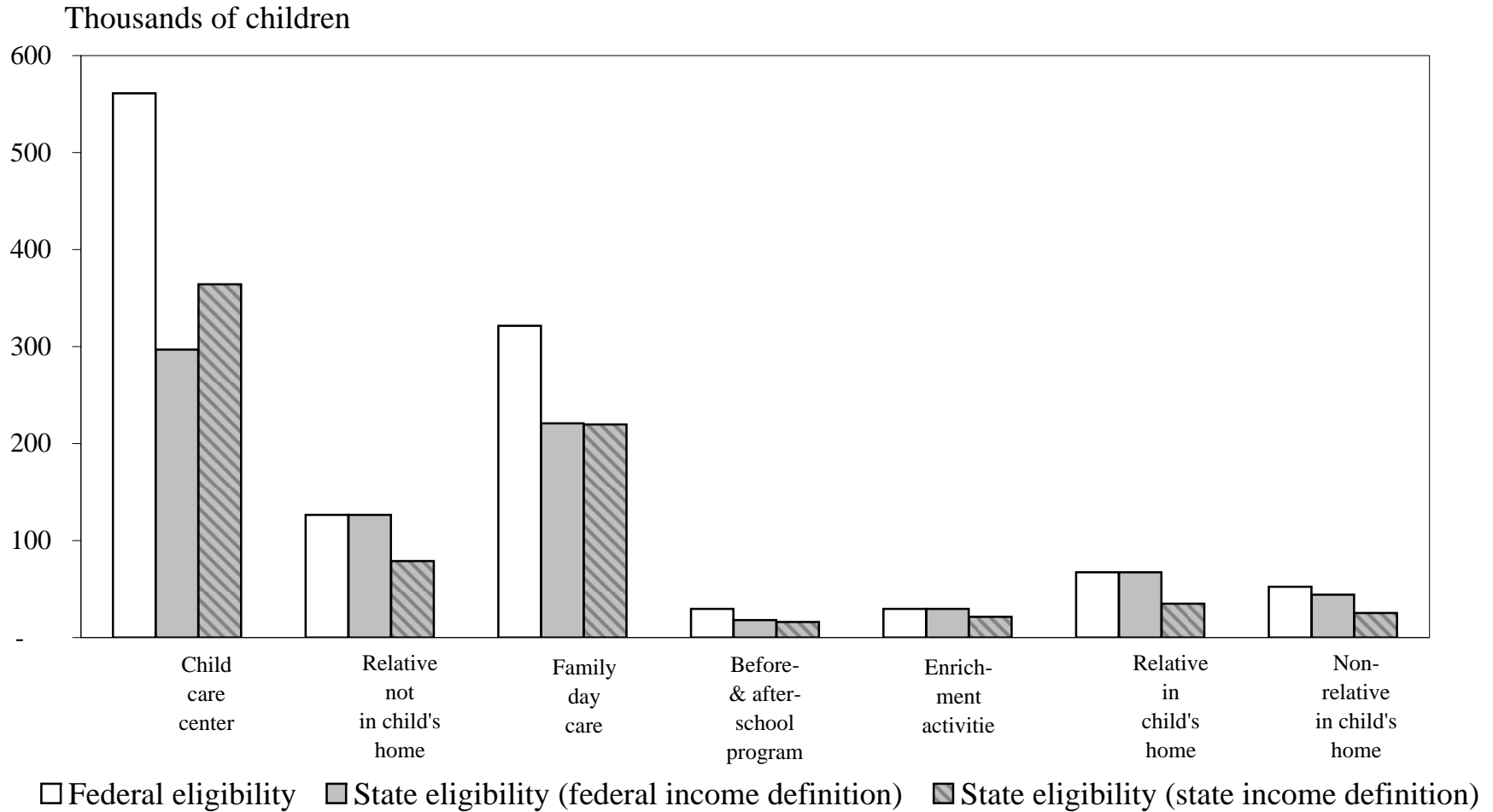
**CCDF, TANF, and SSBG Subsidy Recipients by Arrangement

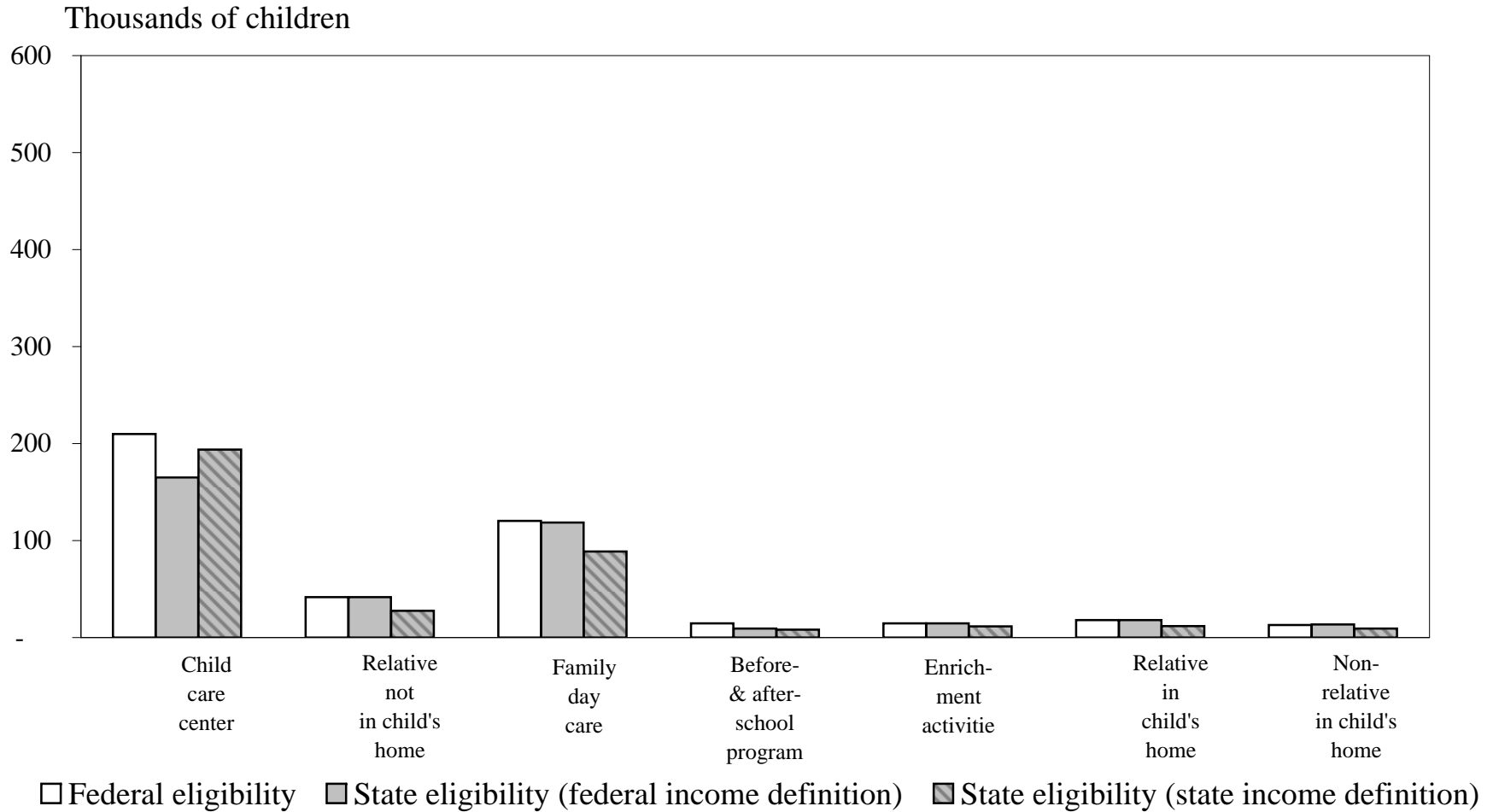

**Federal vs. State Rules (150–199% of Poverty, School Year, 1999–2001)**

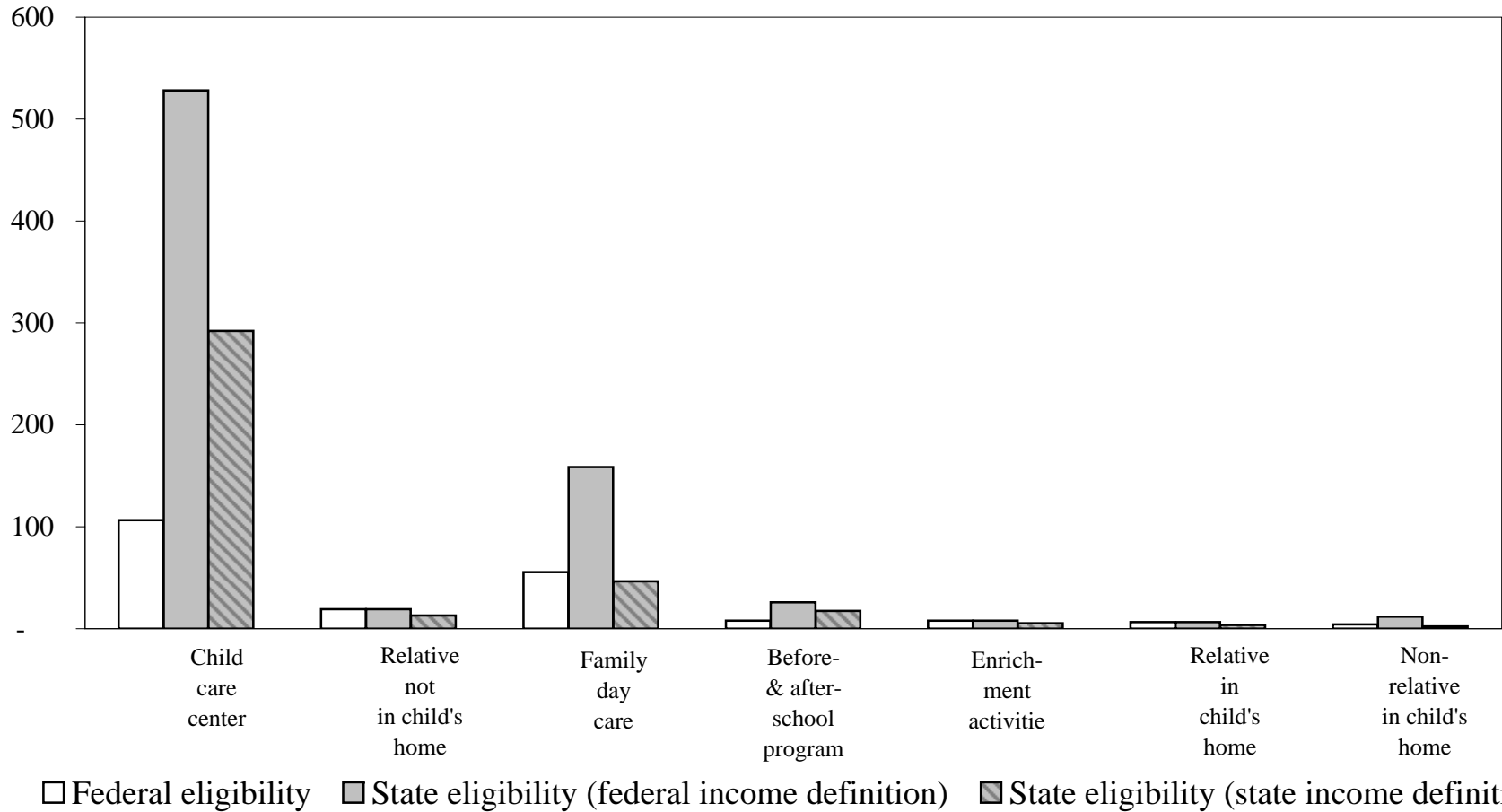

Federal vs. State Rules (200% of Poverty to 85% of SMI, School Year, 1999–2001)**

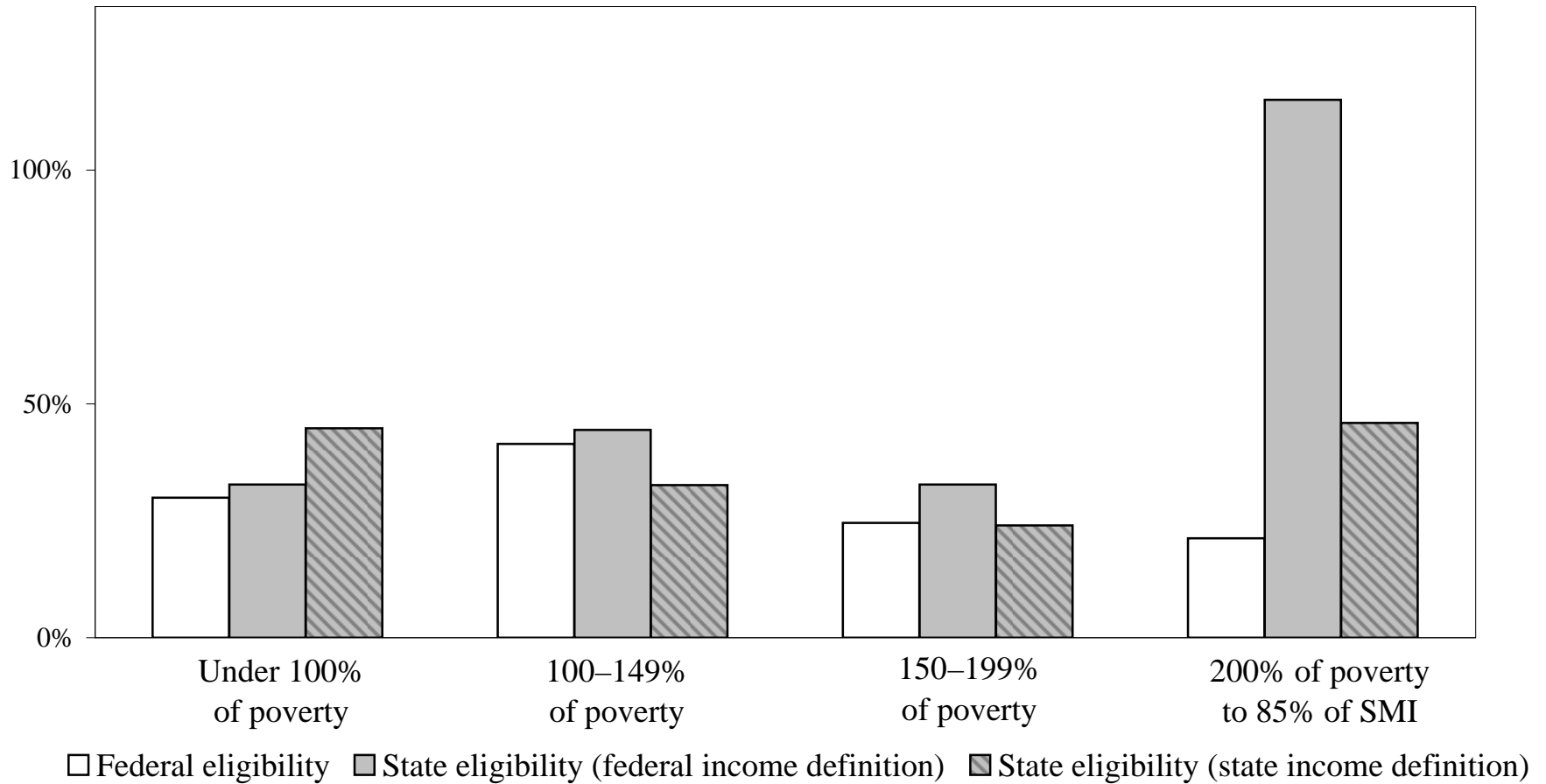

**Federal vs. State Rules (School Year, 1999–2001)**

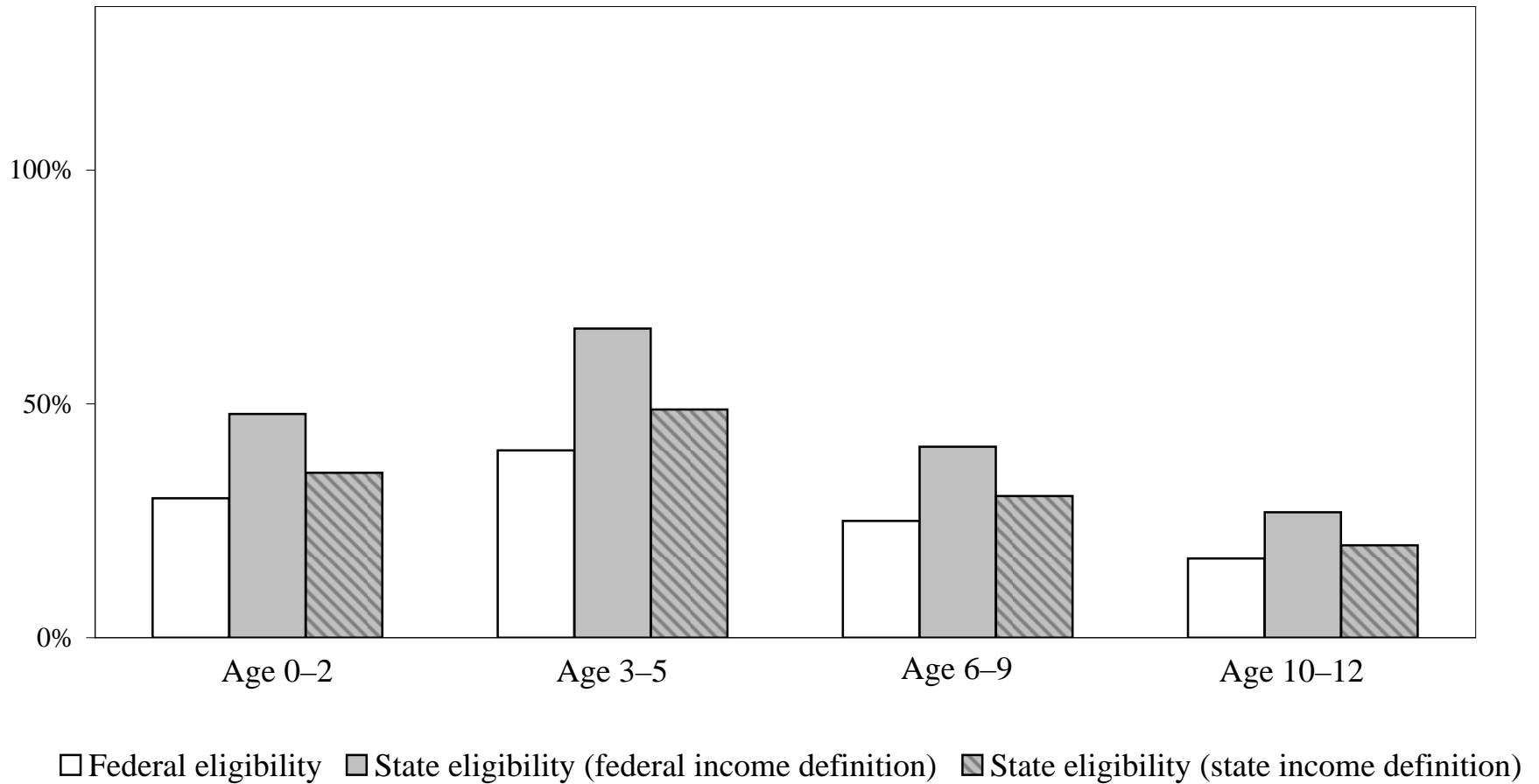

**Federal vs. State Rules (School Year, 1999–2001)**

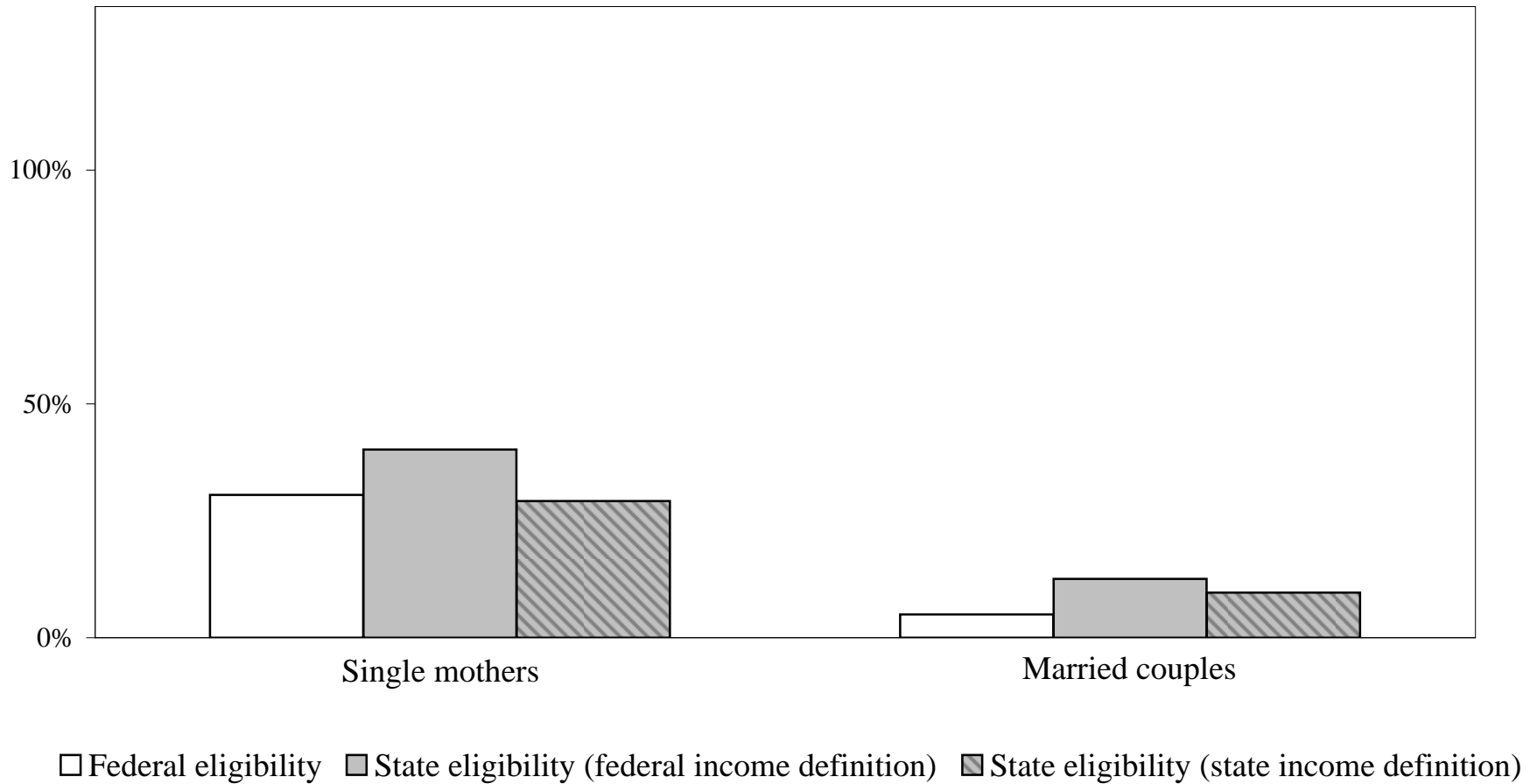

Percent of eligible children

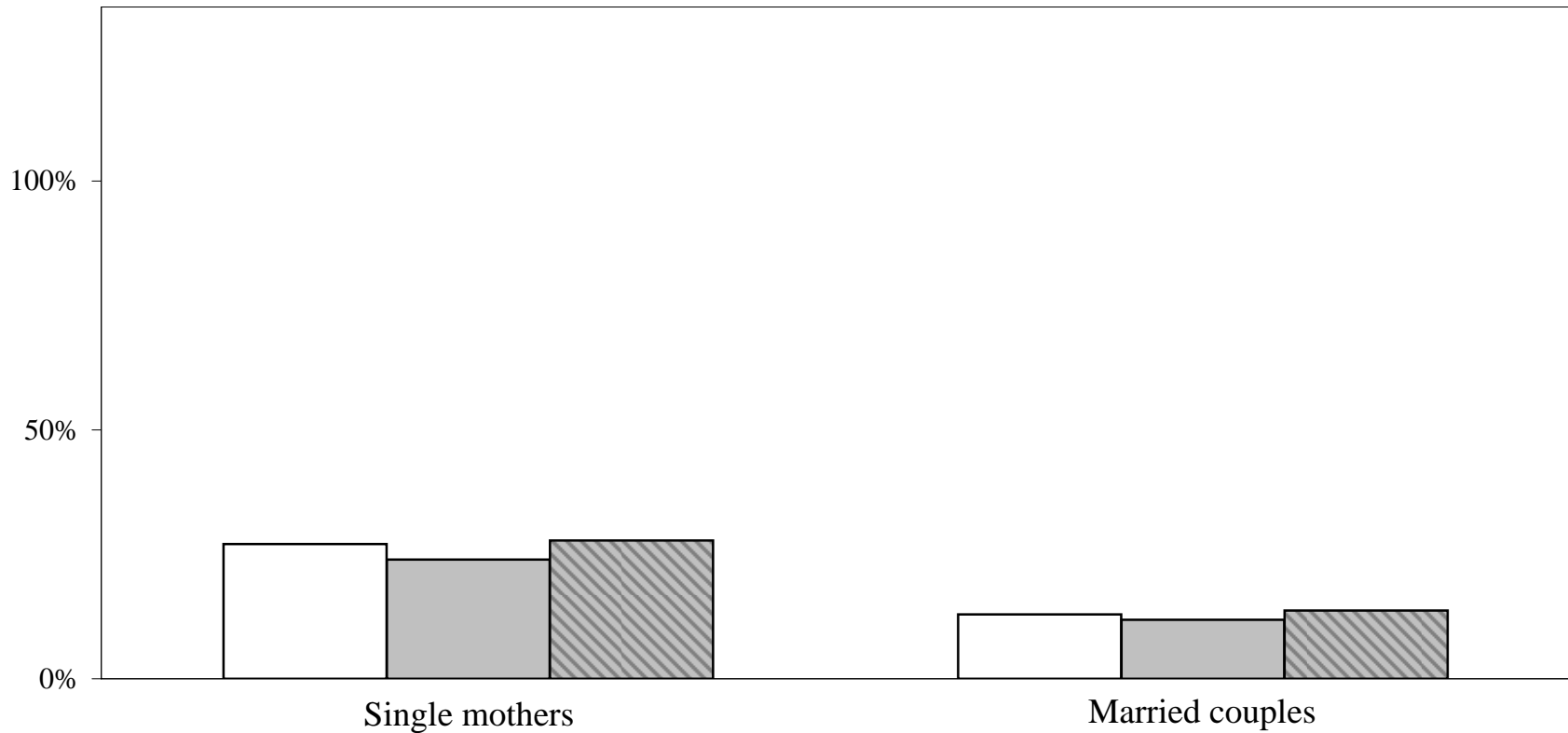

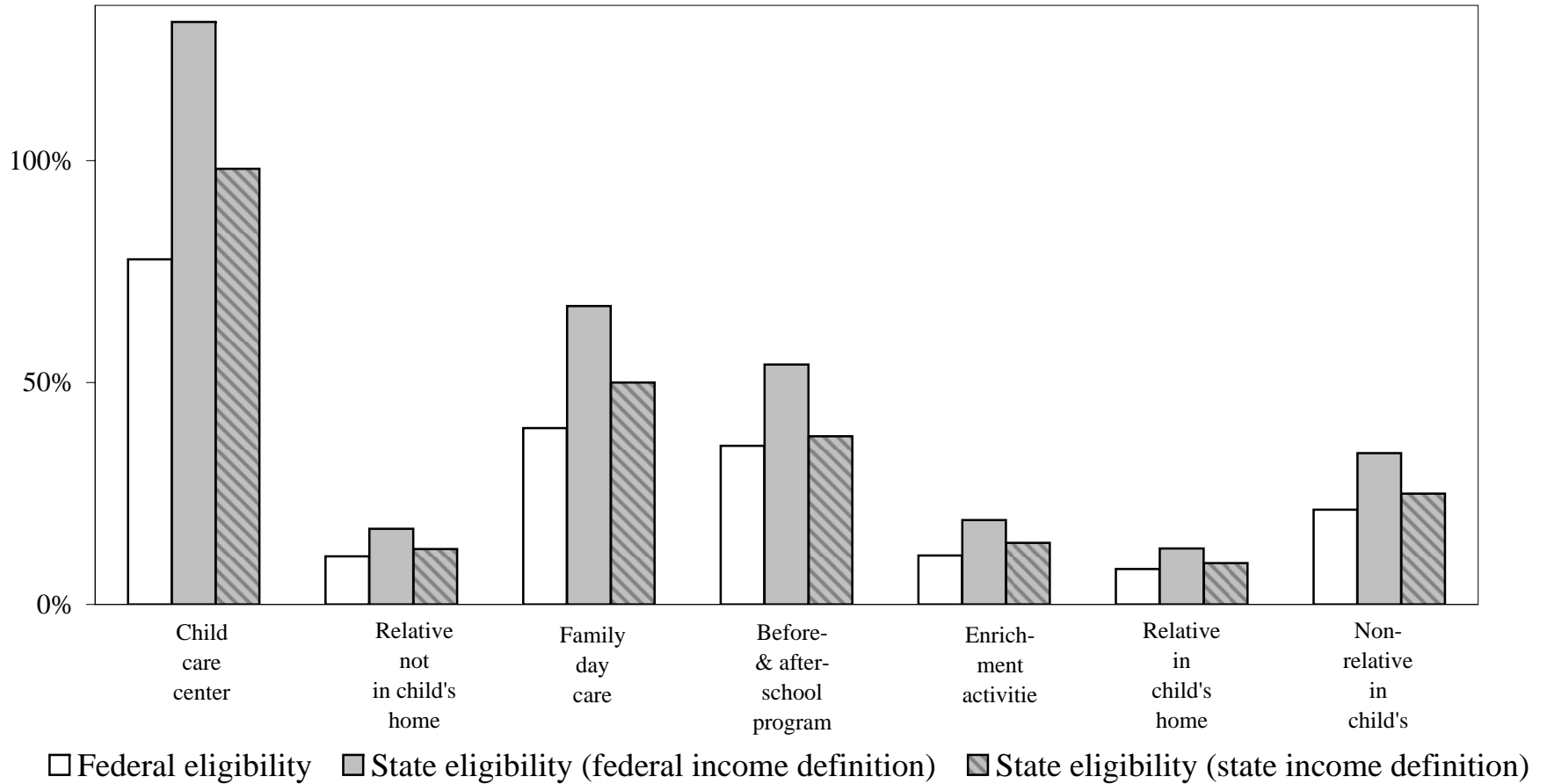

Percent of eligible children

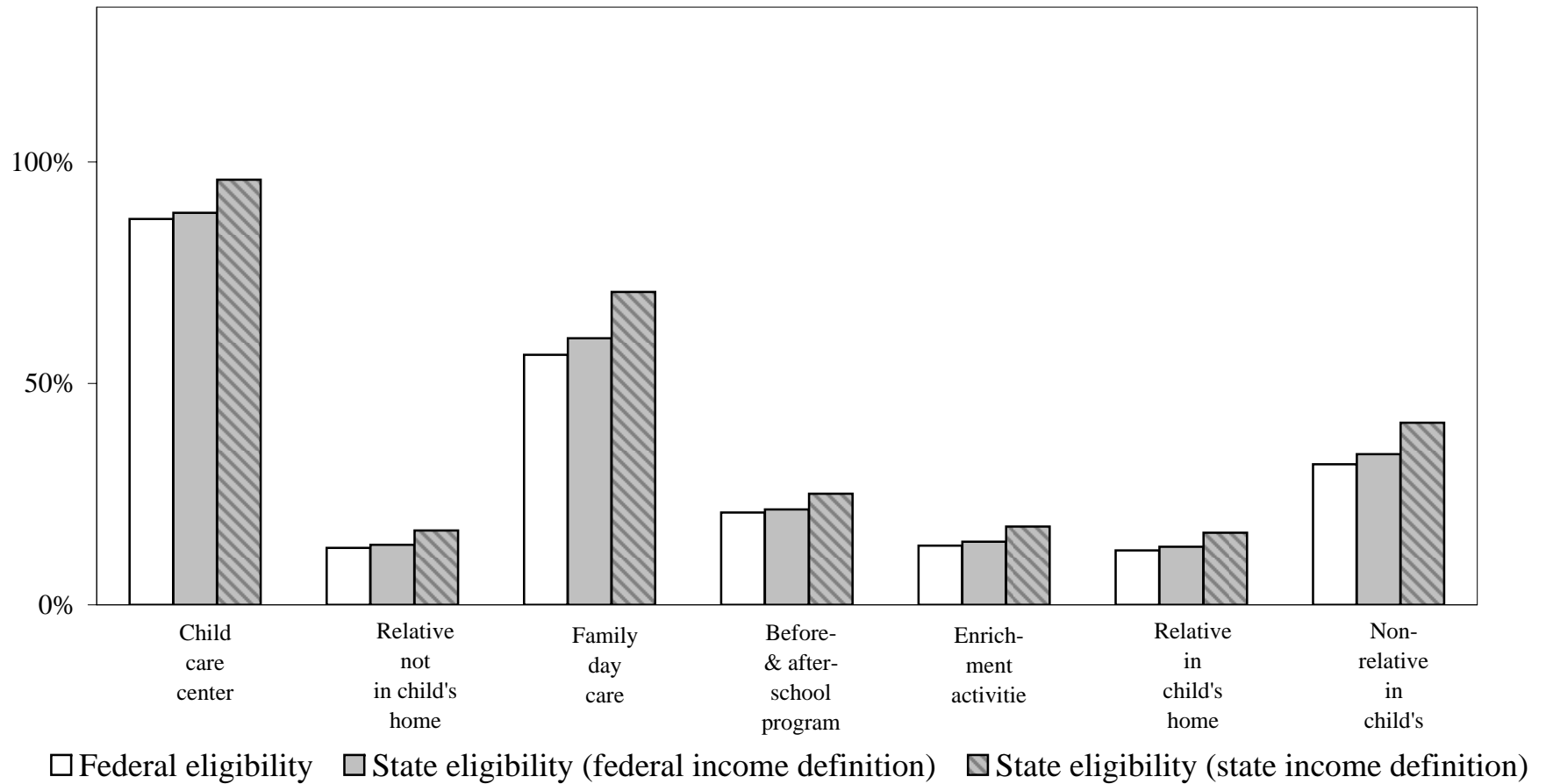

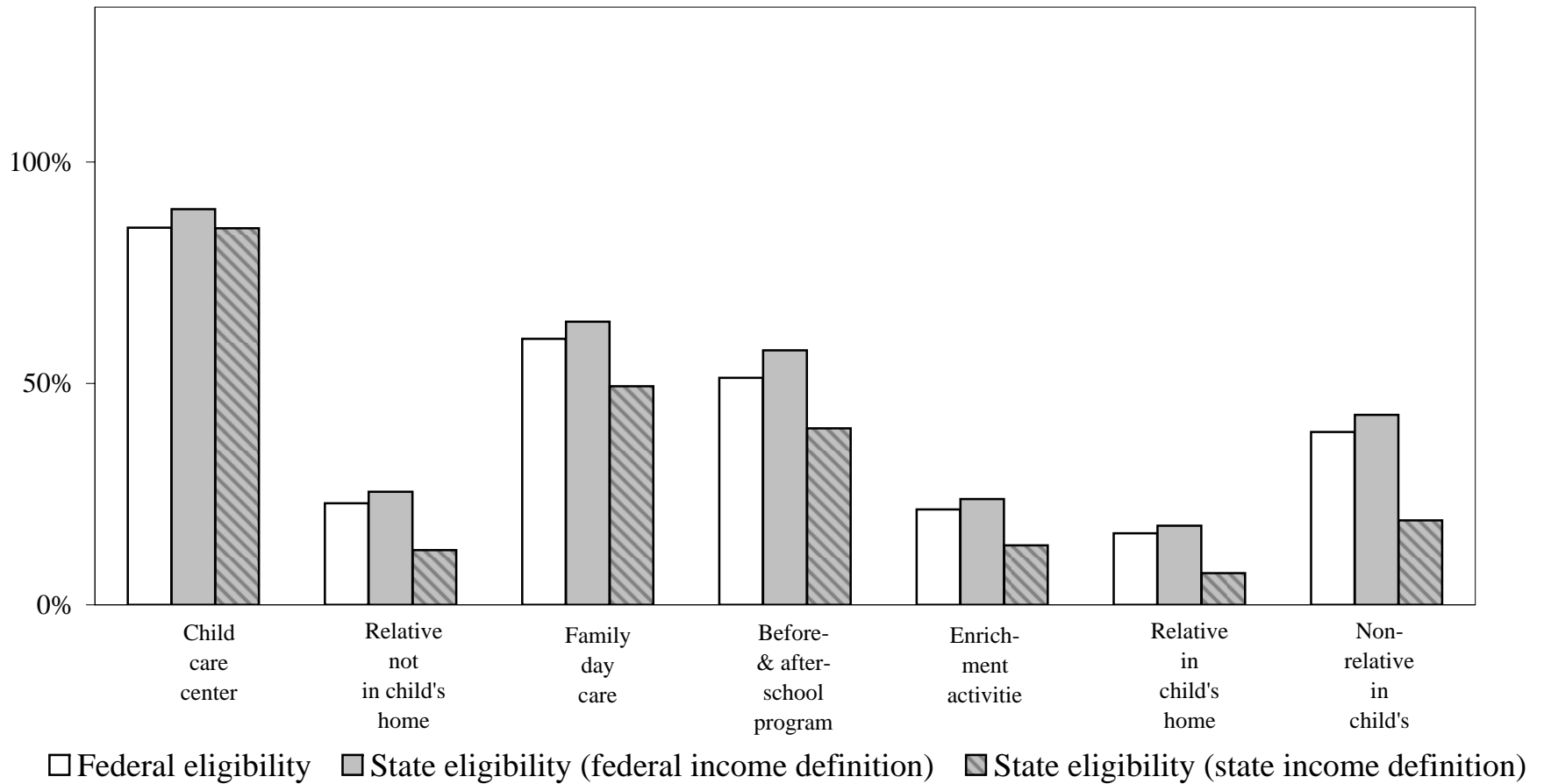

**Federal vs. State Rules (100–149% of Poverty, School Year, 1999–2001)**

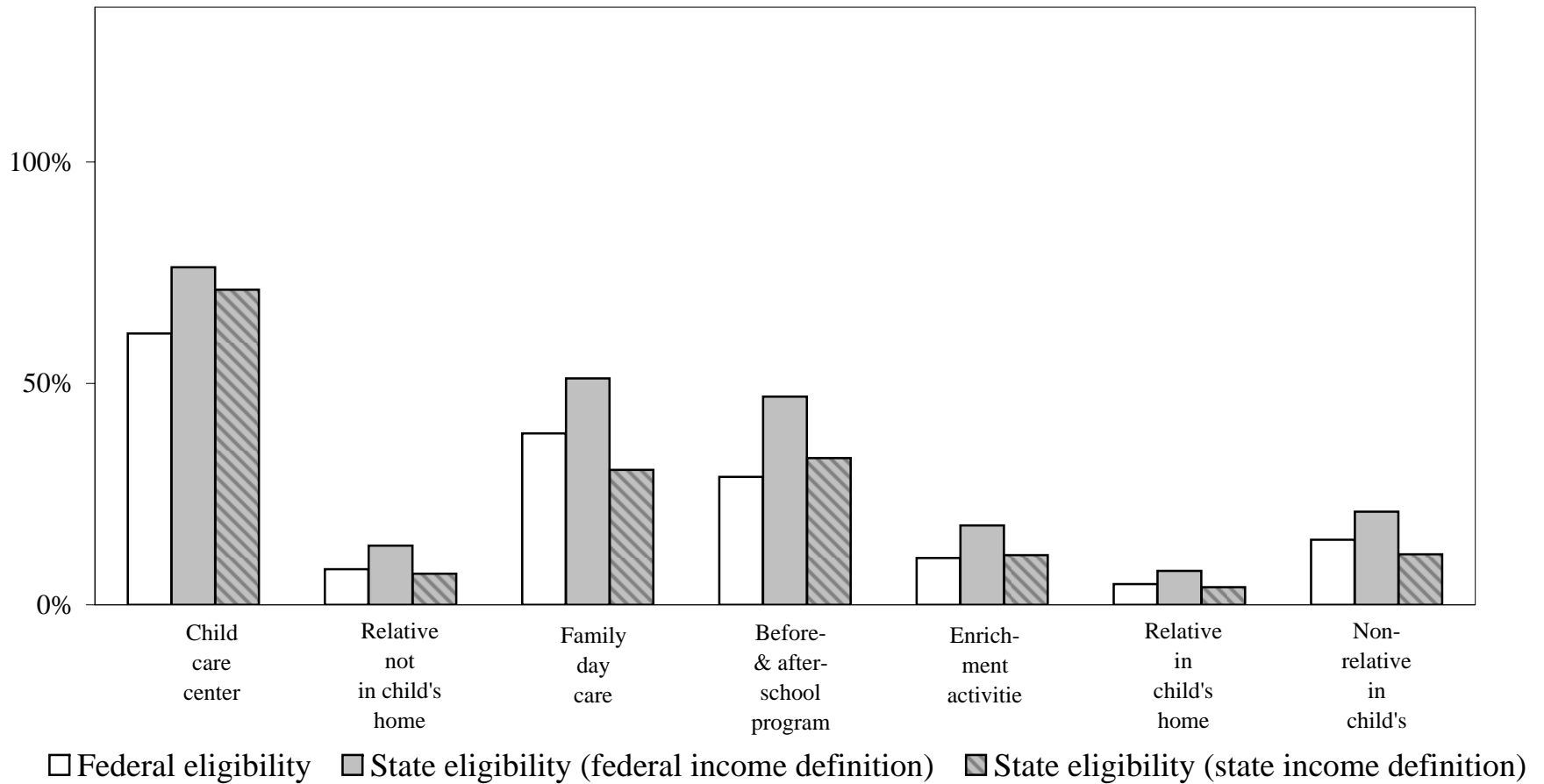

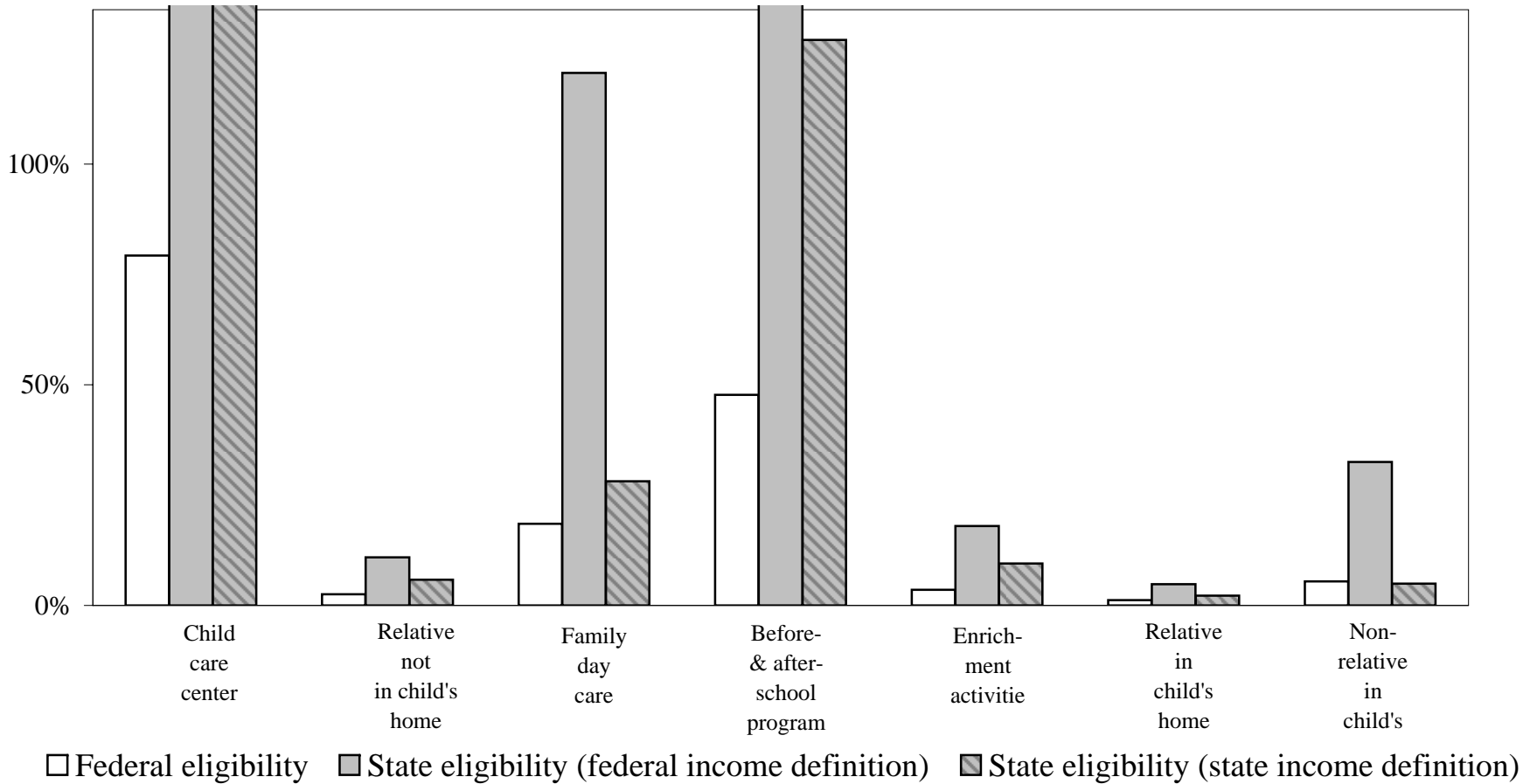

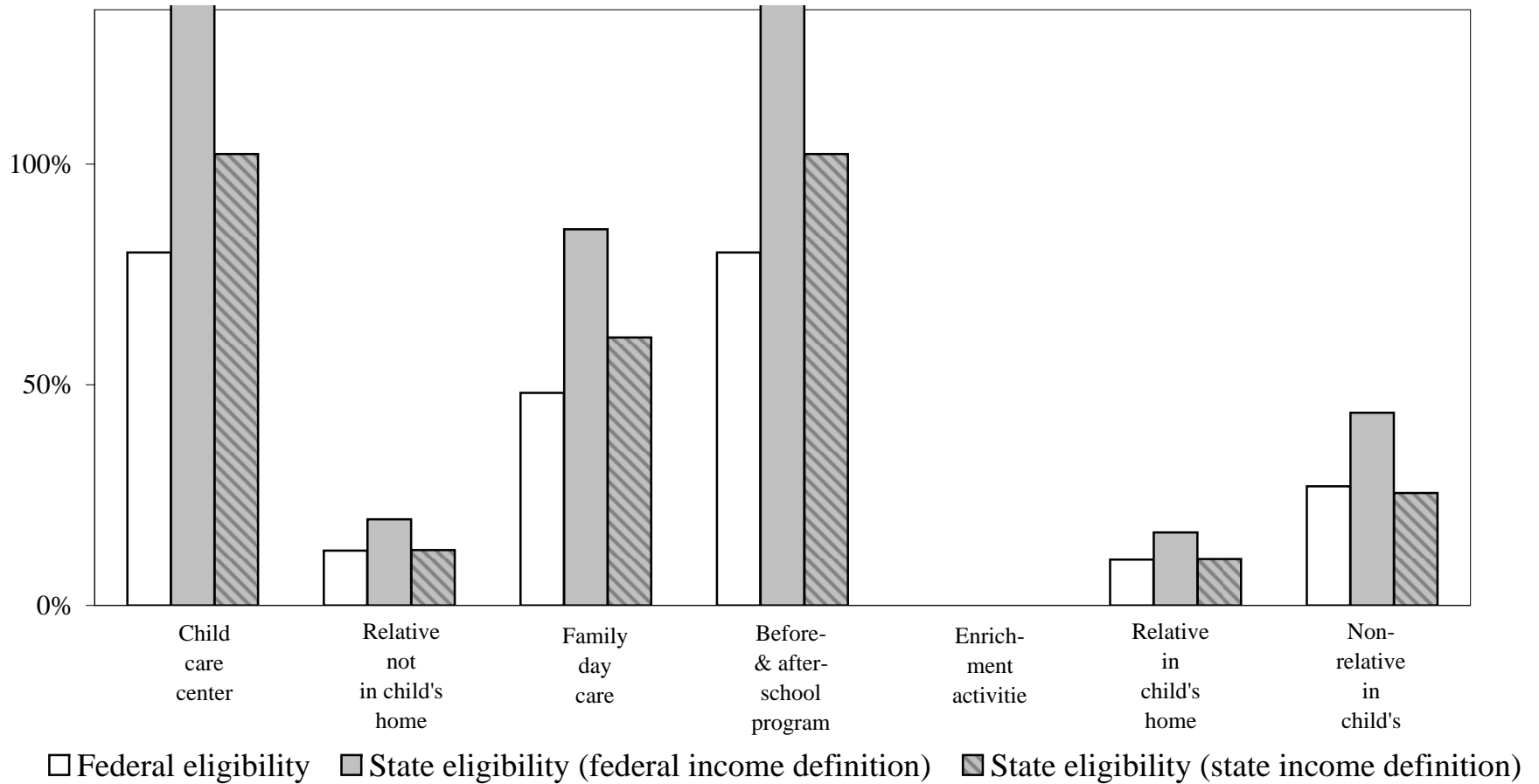

**Federal vs. State Rules (All Income Levels, School Year, 1999–2001)**

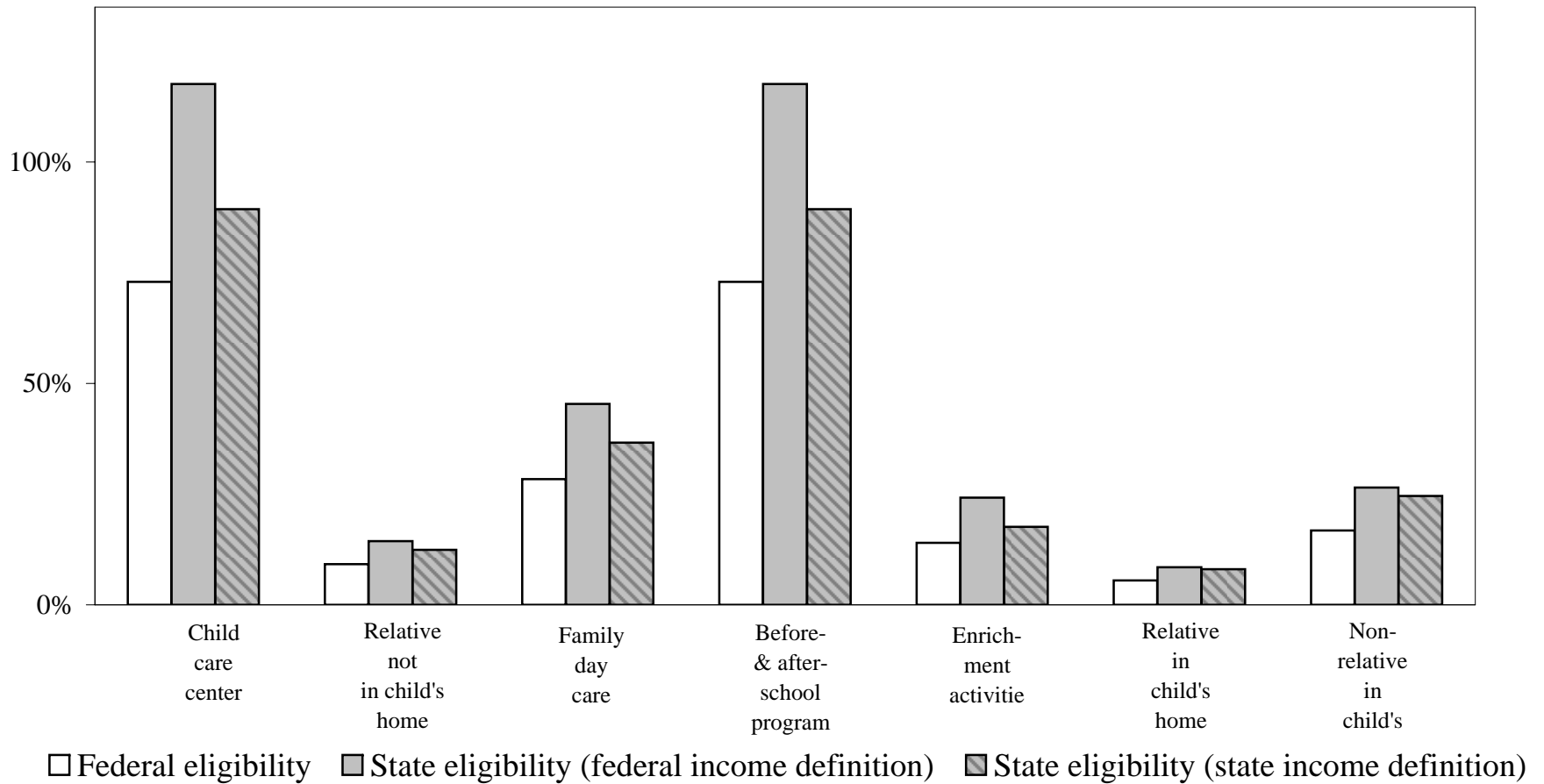
Percent of eligible children in full-time care
